

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### About Cal State Fullerton Teacher Pathway Partnership

The Cal State Fullerton Teacher Pathway Partnership program trains and supports disadvantaged youth and adults to become after-school leaders and fully credentialed teachers in their home communities.

Students participating in Cal State Fullerton Teacher Pathway Partnership receive a step-by-step pathway to obtain their:

- ▶ Associate's degree from a participating community college,
- ▶▶ Bachelor's degree from Cal State Fullerton, and
- ▶▶▶ California teaching credential.

Cal State Fullerton Teacher Pathway Partnership places an emphasis on preparing teachers to fill the demand for more science and math teachers. The program focuses on the integration of **Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)** experiences throughout coursework and workforce training. Participating students are encouraged to seek careers as STEM teachers, especially in elementary and secondary schools.

Cal State Fullerton is partnering with three community colleges – **Fullerton College, Santa Ana College** and **Santiago Canyon College** – as well community-based social services organization and state-funded Workforce Investment Boards, and local after-school providers to bring this innovative program to Orange County students.
