

Your presentation should be about 30 minutes and then plan on answering questions for 15 minutes. Use Powerpoint or a blog as a base.

Please don't freak out about this presentation. Honestly, freaking out won't help, and it really is a positive, wonderful thing that you get to show what you know.

There has been a tradition at this school of making a bigger deal of Senior Exhibition than is necessary. As I understand it, there have also been some difficult

moments in presentations. Your 3rd panel is on May 6th. Expect to have your presentation ready to go by April 29th. We'll spend a full week in class rehearsing the presentation, running technical checks, critiquing each other's work and practicing until presentation is comfortable.

In your presentation, you need to do this:

- USE INTERACTIVITY
- HAVE AN ENGAGING INTRODUCTION
- USE MULTIMEDIA
- DESCRIBE TEXT RESEARCH, EXPERIENTIAL RESEARCH, AND SERVICE LEARNING

SOME TIPS TO GET YOU STARTED:

Collect media from your research and from your experiences NOW.

Document your service learning project with a digital camera.

Review your notes: what were the most amazing things you read or saw in your research?

Presentation is a time when you teach what you know but also teach about your process. Other students really do want to know what went wrong and what went right.
